

JUDGE ROAN IN DELEGATES' CONFER

Defense Asks Mistrial When Crowd in the Court Applauds Announcement of the Decision

St. Louis, Mo., Dec. 11.—(Special Telegram.)—The trial of Dr. Harry H. Harkness, secretary of the state board of health, was the first witness called for the Wednesday afternoon session after the jury was called into the room. The direct examination under Solicitor Dorsey was resumed.

Dr. Harkness again asserted very positively that Mary Phagan had suffered violent death at a certain hour, and explained in detail his reasons for reaching this conclusion.

The secretary of the state board of health was examined from the witness stand at 10 o'clock before the cross-examination had begun. He was very weak, he said in response to the court's inquiry, and begged to be excused. He was, however, called back to the stand by Judge Roan, who said that he would permit the doctor to leave the stand if he would give the jury a statement of his own mind.

Dr. Harkness then moved for a mistrial, in this he was also overruled by the judge.

Judge Roan, in his ruling, held that all of Conley's testimony would remain in the record of the case and that Solicitor Dorsey would be allowed to cross-examine the doctor's testimony.
