JUDGE ROAN'S SENTENCE OF FRANK TO DEATH

STATE OF GEORGIA, vs. LEO M. FRANK. Judgment of guilty, July term, 1918. Whereupon, it is considered, ordered and adjudged by the court that the said Leo M. When asked by the House correspondent if he intended to register his objection, Mr. Mann declared that he would not do so.

JUDGE ROAN CHARGES JURY THAT THEY BE SOBE JUDGES OF WITNESSES' CREDIBILITY
