

Message in Friendly Terms Insists That American Lives And Ships Be Safeguarded

Denies Lusitania Was Armed, But Declares Such Points Irrelevant to Question of Legality of Methods Used in Sinking Vessel-Offers to Consider, However, Any Convincing Evidence Germany May Offer on This Matter.

Washington, June 10.-The United States in its latest note to Germany, made public tonight, formally asks the imperial government for assurances that measures hereafter will be adopted to safeguard "American lives and American ships" on the high seas. The alternative in case of refusal is not stated.

It was this note to which William Jennings Bryan refused to attach his signature, resigning instead his portfolio of state, thereby precipitating a dramatic cabinet crisis. Robert Lansing, secretary of state ad interim, signed the communication, which went forth with the approval of President Wilson and his entire cabinet.

Friendly terms characterize the document, which renews representations made in the American note of May 15, after the Lusitania was torpedoed and sunk. The German government, it is declared, "must have been misinformed" when it assumed that the Lusitania carried guns, as official information is at hand to corroborate the original contention of the Washington government that the Lusitania was an unarmed passenger ship which, since it did not resist capture, could not be sunk without transferring passengers and crew to a place of safety.







WOMEN ON CIVIC BOARDS.

Wilkinson of twenty-five women in additionto the one hundred men, who are to make a survey of Atlanta's various civic institutions with a view to arousing a general interest in their welfare, is a just and progressive incident in his able adminis-

If the women appointed bring to the aid of the men the same organized effort and continuity of purpose expressed in their recent survey and exploitation of conditions in the public schools, they will bring on a civic revival unprecedented in Atlanta's

With no purpose except to arrive at the truth, and then build up the institution of the schools, the organization of women interested went themselves in committees and made their own survey. They acquired information and statistics which proved most valuable to council and board committees \$15,000. who worked for and finally acquired the nec- work done by the alliance for Jewish chilessary appropriation for bettering the physical conditions of the schools.

The same organizations which contributed carnest women to this work can furnish as many more for every department of the city system. There are organizations of women working for parks and playpublic health facilities, better housing conditions and better hospital facilities.

There is not a department in the city's structure that has not a corresponding relation to the home. The average good house keeper realizes this relation and is ready to contribute her knowledge and interest in every department of the city as generously as she has for the schools.

This appointment of women on the chamber of commerce committee to look into civic progress bears out the principle which The Constitution has frequently urged, that women should have representation on certain, if not all, municipal boards. can be no logical argument against it. The city charter will have to be revised to make them eligible under a law made many years ago. The women have asked, through their organizations for this representation, and it is the obligation of the men in power to see that their request is granted.

THE AMERICAN DOLLAR.

One of the interesting, yet very natural, results of the European war has been to give the American dollar a position of greater dignity and prominence in world finance.

Until the war began the standard basis of South American commercial exchange was the English pound sterling-la libra esterlina-in which every Spanish-American merchant made his foreign payments. War interference with this system of finance and the necessity for a substitute was one of the chief subjects of discussion at the recent Pan-American conference in Washington, with the result that the delegates were generally agreed to recommend to their governments the acceptance of dollar drafts on New York in payment of official duties Such action on the part of Latin-American governments would at once make the New York dollar draft pass current in any ordi- patriots. pary commercial transaction.

But the dollar is winning its way abroad in advance of such official recognition. Even that his defeat was largely exaggerated. now American financial institutions are issuing dollar letters of credit on South American countries, where they are being readily accepted, and the indications are their availability will extend to the other important nations of the world as soon as peace is

There will be no war debt, no danger of repudiation, to weaken the standing and strength of the dollar; rather will it take on new life through the strengthening of our gold reserves built up by an ever-increas-

ing trade balance One of the direct benefits from the pop- in the war. .

strengthening of our trade relations, not only in South America, but on other conti nents. It will bring us into an intimate business touch we have not known before because we have not had the opportunity.

It was developed at the Pan-American onference that there are many things to be done before we can hope fully to establish with the Latin-American countries such complete trade relations as we desire. But that will not be left to chance. It has been proposed to make this conference an annual affair, but in the meantime committees will be provided to take care of such matters as demand ad interim attention.

Banking facilities are far from perfect, and improved ocean transportation is essen-tial. These will come as the result of well directed effort. In the meantime, the American dollar has started upon its mission, and with proper assistance given it we may anticinate the achievement of substantial and far-reaching commercial results.

ATLANTA'S JEWISH CHARITIES.

Indicated by the annual report just is sued, the Federation of Jewish Charities of Atlanta is doing a wonderfully effective work or the needy and unfortunate. The federation includes various allied organizations, among them the Jewish Educational alliance the Monteflere Relief association, the Morris Hirsch Free clinic, and what is known as the Free Loan branch, and its relief activities take every needed form.

As in all modern and effective charity work, the plan of restoration to the point or condition of self-help stands uppermost. Through its varied activities the federation makes provision for the material relief of the needy during the period of their rehabilcharges or commission to needy, deserving and self-respecting persons; provides free medical and aurgical service to remove physical disabilities that interfere with selfhelp and, through the alliance, cares for, maintains and educates dependent and de linquent children.

The general work of the federation is briefly set forth in the report in a manner The appointment by President Melt R. that must not only appeal to its members, but prove of interest to all charity workers and persons who give attention to relief work of whatever kind. Tersely told, these are the federation's aims:

Adequate relief to those who need it. Elimination, of the professional hnorrer, the deadbeat and the worth-

Application of the community against promiseuous and generally insufficient and paugerizing giving.

Conservation instead of reclamation. Forming of character instead of reformation.

Independence instead of dependence. Social responsibility and obligation instead of shifting responsibility and addictor relieve the conscience.

Justice instead of charity.

Knowledge of the causes that produce poverty and a same effort to remove the cause rather than a sentimental giving which makes donor and recipient the poorer.

The federation collected and expended for these purposes last year approximately dren, which included recreational affairs entertainments, kindergarten and school assistance, the federation handled 955 appli cations for relief affecting 2,119 persons provided medical or surgical service in 592 new cases, made 75 free loans and carried on relief work in other directions, wherever occasion called for it.

The federation's 525 subscribers will be proud of the excellent showing it has made. It is a work that is worthy both of study and emulation, because it accomplishes un questioned and far-reaching results through application of the most practical and, in the long run, the most efficient methods.





Within a few days, announcement has come of the completion of an interconstal canal which will provide an adequate waterway from Corbus Chisti to New Orleans. The Louisiana Caual.

The canal which has within a few days—according to information which has just reached this city—been completed in Louisiana will, it is believed, greatly facilitate the growth of New Orleans.

With that city near the mouth of the Mississippi and with the great metropolitan district of which Minneapolis is the center at the headwaters of the Mississippi vitally affected by improvement of the navigation of the Mississippi, there should be, in view of the completion of the Panama canal, a very great development of interior commerce transported by water.

In banking circles in this city frequent reference is made to the energy and enthusiasm which characterize Louisiana and New Orleans, and especially the ability with which the state and the city are in great measure financing without outside help the really marvelous improvements that have been in progress for some years. A few days ago New Orleans sold honds to the aggregate value of \$1,250,009 to secure funds with which to pay for the building of one of the largest of grain elevators now standing anywhere in the United States. C. P. Hunting ton, in the last years of his life, used to tell his friends in this city that New Orleans was destined to become second among American cities as a port engaged in foreign commerce:

And when it is known that the port commissioners of New Orleans now control a little under fifty miles of fiver frontage and are utilizing this area for wharfs, elevators and other facilities of trade, then some idea can be obtained of the rapidity with which New Orleans is forging ahead. The iniand waterway connecting New Orleans with Corpus Christi; whose substantial completion was teported in New York a day or two ago, will stimulate further the growth of this city.

Another feature of the development of artificial waterway imprevements is the work the United States is now doing in canalizing, the upper reaches of the Cape Fear river in North Carolina.
