The mayor is to be commended for ad mitting his error and rectifying it and counc'l must be congratulated upon this fortunate and peaceful outcome of a bad situation the making of which could in no wise be charged against it

ITALY'S DIE IS CAST

itaiv's declaration of war against Austria, which has come at last creates about as much of a stir in the world as does a pebble upon the surface of a nond. The world was more than prepared for it, has been for some months in fact the world has suf fered somewhat keen disappointment over what has appeared to be useless and unnec essary delay. It is not that the disappoint ment was due to a desire to see more bloodshed it was rather a firm belief in the certainty of Italy's ultimate action (coupled with the hope that prompt Italian participation would mean a speedier end to hostilities throughout Europe

Now, however, the civilized world look: thon Italy's declaration merely as an incl. dent of the war It has lost confidence in the possibilities of Italian achievement, not because it believes Italy is any less pre pared to enter the contest, but because it

knows the Austrians and Germans are het ter prepared than it was ever thought they would be to meet the Italian onslaught. A few months ago Italy could have begun the war well within Austrian territory, prob ably by just such a rushing march as carried Germany into France Today she will be fortunate to begin it at the Austrian boundary

The German advantage was won both by peedy decision and prompt action That is why Germany is fighting today on French territory In the same manner Italy might have carried the war deep into the enemy s country, perhaps to the gates of the Aus trian capital Now she must pay in men Def this ks hits mighty funny—

Nevertheless Italy a die is cast and she is in the war same to the finish She must fight and fight hard There is no nation engaged on the side of the allies to which a German victory would mean greater dis ester. Germany pretends not to hate France and Belgium, she openly admits a deep rooted hatred for Italy The German em peror would enjoy nothing better than play ing Napoleon with the Italian kingdom

Italy doubtless realizes that she must fight for her life, for her very existence. The fact that she must have realized this from the very beginning makes her delay still more difficult to understand

The world will watch with eager interest the effect of Italian aggressiveness in this continental war but it will watch without that same hope of an early peace which but a few short months ago seemed almost within easy reach

WILL THERE BE REPUDIATION?

If the European war continues until July 31 a period of one year from its com mencement it is stated based upon expen ditures to date that it will have cost the participating nations the staggering sum of \$35 702 000 000 or more than thirty five times the entire national debt of the United

The British parliament has just been asked for an appropriation of \$5 682 000,000 for the purpose of carrying on the war for another year. The war is said to be costing Great Britain \$10,500,000 a day and most of the other nations involved about the same amount excepting Germany whose expenses are close to double that sum Germany's total expenses for the first year of the war are put at \$9480 000 000 as against \$4 790 800 000 for England more than \$6,000,000,000 each for France Austria Hungary and Russia and about \$2,432,000,000 for Belglum These figures do not take into account

the loss of life which means just that much removed from the field of production and increase of world wealth nor do they con sider the property destruction which in individual instances such as that of the Lusitanua will run as high as \$1,000,000 or

Consideration of these stupendous figures naturally brings up the question as to whether there will be repetition of history in the shape of repudiation of European obligations. If the war goes on for another year both expenditures and property losses will have been doubled possibly increased in even greater proportion. The victims will demand war indemnities which the van quished will be compelled to pay and pay ment will mean heavy taxation and possible semi-pauperism extending over a period of

If forced to pay the debts of the victors will not the vanquished seek wherever pos sible to escape from their own? To escape not because they do not wish to pay but because they cannot pay? Saddle the largest of nations with a debt of a billion to be paid In a single year, and it is tantamount to reducing that nation to slavery for the time being Even war indemnities however are not put upon that basis France had scarcely finished paying Germany the trib ute demanded as the result of the Franco-Prussian war of 1870 when the present war broke out

But war expenses in these days are very different from what they were even a half century ago Where they were millions then they are hundreds of millions today speed and slaughter have brought tremen dously added cost War is carried on upon a credit basis, if it involved actual money ceased long ago for the lack of cash

How far can (Furopean nations go in the se of their credits? That is the problem And what vill the defeated nations have to add to the credits already negotiated in the way of war indemnities as the price of peace? How can any of the participating nations pay short of the prolonged if tem porary' slavery of their people?

Not one of the nations invoived is going to let the money problem stand in the way of its prosecution of the war and vet the time is inevitably coming when settlement must be made Will it be settlement or will it he, in some instances at least, repudiation?






