> Washington, May 30 .--- Germany's reply to the American note concerning the sinkof the Lusitania with a loss of more than 100 American lives produced a feeling of profound disappointment here. Dissatisfaction at the failure of Germany to answer the demands of the United States was reflected in government circles generally.

> President Wilson had retired early—before the text arrived, but from a reading of the summary published today and Ambassador Gerard's forecast, herhad an accurate impression of what it contained.

> Secretary Bryan would make no comment. Other cabinet officers were reticent, but there was little concealment anywhere that the answer from Berlin had produced grave situation in the relations between the United States and Germany. Just what course of action the United States will pursue is undetermined.

SWEEP OF DIXIE HIGHWAY

With the entrance of Michigan into the Divie highway movement now assured this splendid road development will sweep the ountry all the way from north to south, from the apex of the Michigan peninsula almost to the Florida Keys from the upper Great lases to the lower Atlantic and the Gult

So eager was Michigan to participate in the Dixie highway movement that the gov ernor of the state named two commissioners who attended the recent meeting of the board in Chattanooga and it was there agreed that the Divie Highway association would extend links of the highway from indianapolis to South Bend, Ind., near the Michigan line, and from Dayton Ohio through Lima to Toledo, if Michigan would agree to complete a loop from South Bend entirel around the peninsula through Niles, Petoskey Mackinak Bay City, Detroit and back to Toledo Arrangements to this end, placed by the commission in the hands of Carl G Fisher of Indianapolia have just been completed and Mr Fisher informs the members of the commission that Michigan has agreed to open and maintain a well paved highway entirely around the state as indicated

Thus not only has the Dixie highway begun to extend beyond the original plans of its projectors but everywhere there is evidence of its substantial construction in advance of the time at which it was provided material progress must be shown The Michigan commissioners have accepted the agreement in good faith and promised immediate and rapid work on the peninsula loop

in eastern Tennessee there have already been authorized \$1 500 000 of bonds for the construction of the Knoxville link of the highway from Chattanooga northward toward Cincinnati

THE STATE IN BUSINESS

Georgia is in business just the same in measure, as is any firm or corporation It collects money from the citizen for the service which it renders him and it dis burses that money in payment for what it needs. What reason is there, then for the state putting itself above and beyond the ordinary laws of business? Why should there be one rule for the government of the citizen in business transactions and an other and more advantageous one for the state?

We are moved to ask these questions as the result of an opinion of the attorney general in which he holds that there is no liability on the part of the state agricultural schools or other state institutions, for the payment of interest on past due accounts They are state agencies he says and are. therefore not subject to interest charges Isn't the state setting a bad example to its citizens in assuming this attitude? We are forcibly reminded in this connection that the state itself insists upon interest payments upon overdue taxes, and it looks like another case of a poor rule December 20 or thereabouts, is always, the last day for the payment of state taxes, and the un fortunate citizen who through inability to pay or other cause delays his settlement, mist add 7 per cent per annum to the amount or suffer the same penalty as if he had failed to pay altogether

This 7 per cent which the state collects on past due taxes sen_tt a matter of simple business rule it is absolute law it is probably collected from hundreds, if not a few thousands of citizens every year And yet when it comes to an ordinary business proposition such as the payment to a citizen of simple interest on an overdue account the state save neither it nor its institutions are hable

It is difficult to conceive upon what theory a decision of this sort was rendered Everybody understands, of course that the state is sovereign and cannot be sued for debt or anything else But that should be the more reason why the state should con form to well established business customs The state cannot borrow money without paying interest on it, and it should be just as ready to meet interest payments in those ordinary cases where the business world recognizes the justice of it and where the citizen would be required by law to pay it

under similar circumstances We would respectfully suggest in the in

terests of the state's good faith that here is a decision which should be reviewed and made to conform to well known and recog nized business practice-if not to common honesty
