Still No Help for Our Merchant Marine

There are to-day only five American ships regularly in the trans-Facific trade. They have to meet competition from The Ganadian-Facific Steamhip Company; subsidy, \$218,000 a year. So that there is little dance of building up a merchant marine in the great Pacific so long as Congress continues to neglect these interests; and there is every chance of losing the little we have left.

Our merchant marine is thus vanishing, first, because it costs more to build a ship in America than in Japan or Grest British or Germany, that extra cost being nearly all the extra cost of labor under the American standards of living. Second, it costs more to operate an American ship for precisely the same reason.


