In the utter absence of all charges against him, is not the arbitrary espionage or investigation of a judge by the Department of Justice, under the direct order of the Attorney General, to treat him as if he were wholly careless of his reputation and good name?
"His examiner holds the fate of the judge in the hollow of his hand. And all the while, be it re-

membered, there are no charges pending against the judge, where such charges should be made. The examiner imparts to the judge no information whatever of any complaint. There is no chance for de-

fense.
