MEMORIAL OF LEO FRANK'S MURDER

Leo Frank was a Jewish-American factory superintendent who was lynched on August 17, 1915. Frank had been convicted of murder and sentenced to death in 1913 after a trial which was defined by anti-Semitism. The trial illustrated the need for an organization like the Anti-Defamation League, which was founded that same year. When Frank's sentence was commuted to life in prison, he was kidnapped from the county jail and hanged from a tree. In 1986 Frank was pardoned by the State of Georgia. Frank's body is interred at the Old Mount Carmel Cemetery in Glendale, Queens.
