## SAYS EMPLOYER SLEW GIRL.

Negro Tells of Helping Leo Frank Conceal Body.

ATLANTA, Aug. 4.—James Conley, a negro, to-day testified that he helped Leo M. Frank, charged with the murder of fourteen-year-old Mary Phagan, dispose of the girl's body after she had been killed by Frank.

Led to the witness stand by Chief of Police Beavers and Chief of Detectives Lanford, Conley declared that on several occasions he stood on guard for Frank when the latter had women visitors in his office in a local factory. Frank, according to the negro's testimony, was accustomed to stamp on the floor when he desired Conley to keep watch. The negro testified Mary Phagan went to Frank's office about noon on the day of her disappearance. Shortly thereafter, he testified, Frank stamped on the floor and the negro took his accustomed post.
