

May Save Leo M. Frank from Execution; He Is Reported Transferred to Prison Farm

ATLANTA, Ga., Monday, June 21, 3:30 A. M.—A persistent report is in circulation tonight that Leo M. Frank was removed secretly from the Fulton County Jail shortly before midnight and sent, under heavy guard, to the State farm at Milledgeville.

All efforts to verify the report have been fruitless.

Officials at the railway station assert that Frank was on a train leaving here shortly after midnight. Governor Slaton declines to discuss the report, and the jail officials will give no information.

Attorney Henry Alexander of Frank's counsel said: "I infer sentence has been commuted."

Mrs. Leo M. Frank when told of the rumor of the removal of her husband from jail said:

"I am not surprised."
