CHICAGO, May 11.—A big mass meeting will be held in this city next Sunday, which is being planned as a Leo M. Frank day, at which it is expected 100,000 signatures to petitions will be obtained. An appeal will be made to Governor J. M. Slaton and the Prison Board of Georgia for a commutation of Frank's death sentence.

Governor Edward F. Dunne has been asked to head the list of speakers at the meeting. Others who will speak are Bishop Samuel Fallows, ex-Judge McKenzie Cleland, Father P. J. O'Callaghan, Attorney Patrick H. O'Donnell, Grace Wilbur Trout, Leonore Z. Meder, Father S. J. Siedenbergl, Harriet Taylor Treadwell, and Clarence Darrow.

The following day will see nearly two hundred women in the loop and outlying districts with petitions. It is planned to have eight women on each intersection, and it is thought that at least 100,000 signatures will be secured in this way.

Four Judges of the Appellate Court in Chicago have signed petitions. They are Judges Kickham Scanlan, H. Baum, Edward O. Brown, and Charles Mc-Surely.
